So, people remembered by God, recount this to your neighbor when you greet them with "Happy New Year." Encourage them even in their sorrow that there is a God who loves them and is resolved eternally to embrace them in mercy, forgiveness, and joyful life in Christ Jesus.

In Christ, Happy New Year and Happy New Covenant! and may it truly fill your heart!






